Toledo Piano Teachers Association Mentorship Program

<u>Mission</u>: The purpose of the TPTA Mentorship Program is to give potential and current TPTA members the opportunity to broaden their teaching experience through educational seminars and lesson observations with experienced master teachers. To give master teachers the opportunity to pass on their teaching legacies, and to build relationships between members.

- 1. For college students and teachers new to the industry: To provide training to help them build a successful private teaching studio, while sharing members' pedagogical knowledge of technique and repertoire that will promote excellence in teaching. Program completion would award applicants active membership status in TPTA.
- 2. For teachers with less than five years of teaching experience who have made application to TPTA for additional support and personal education for their studios.
- 3. Current members of TPTA who would like to broaden their teaching with additional observation and educational opportunities

Program Requirements:

- 1. **Completion:** Program to be completed within 12 months. Extensions may be granted by special permission of the Apprenticeship Chairs for special circumstances.
- 2. **Seminars:** Mentees to attend three required seminars on various topics offered by master teachers.
- 3. **Observations:** Mentee to observe 9 lessons conducted by at least three different Master Teachers. Three different areas of Concentration are required with a minimum of three lessons per concentration. Lessons to be a minimum of 30 minutes each. Follow up phone call or email with Master Teachers are encouraged in order to ask questions and gain further understanding.
- 4. **Final Presentation:** Upon completion of the required seminars candidates will present their studio observations, studio business plan and appropriate materials; studio policy, resume, technology, website (if applicable), etc. to the membership.

Concentrations: The following Concentrations make up the Core Program. Observation provided by Master Teachers.

- 1. Beginner Specialist Studio observation of working with Beginners
- 2. Intermediate Specialist Studio observation of working with Intermediate students
- 3. Advanced Specialist Studio observation of working with Advanced students.
- 4. Adult Specialist Studio observation of working with Adult Students
- 5. Suzuki Specialist Studio observation, one on one discussion may be requested.
